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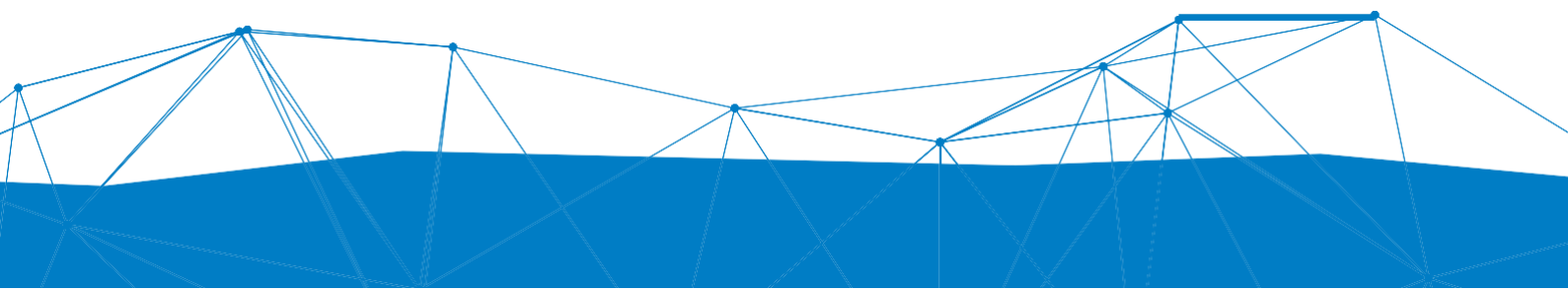


Figure 1. Author Collaboration Networks (1997-2026). Nodes represent authors and connecting lines indicate collaborations between them. The size of the nodes is proportional to authors' disciplines' influence. The thickness of the connecting lines is proportional to the strength of collaboration

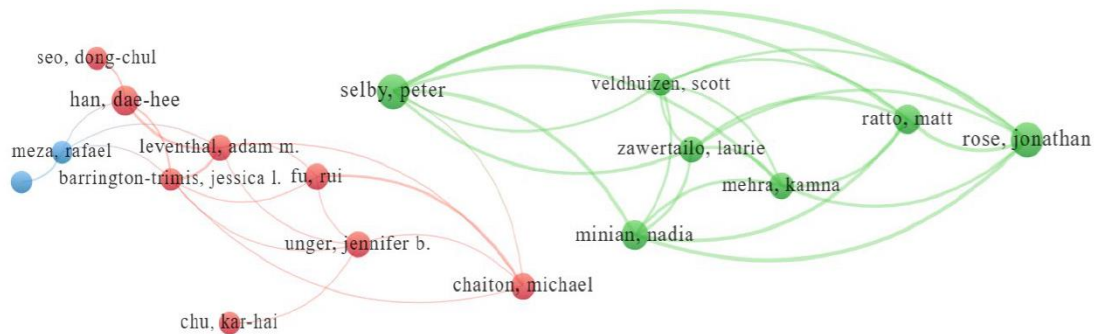


Figure 2. Disciplinary Collaboration Networks (1997-2026). Nodes represent disciplines and connecting lines indicate collaborations between them. The size of the nodes is proportional to the disciplines' influence. The thickness of the connecting lines is proportional to the strength of collaboration

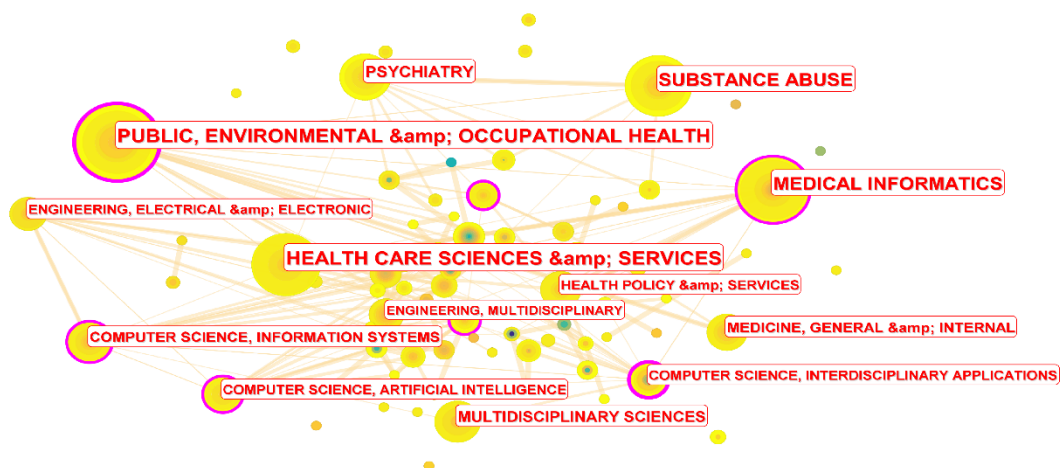


Figure 5. Bursts (1997-2026). Blue line segments mark the start and end years of publication for articles, while red line segments highlight periods of a sharp increase in citation counts
